Identifying Victims of Human Trafficking

Law Enforcement shifted from reactive to proactive, intelligence-led investigation. Advocates are embedded directly into operations to help with regulation and reduce retraumatization, and remind that services are not contingent on cooperation with law enforcement.

Partnerships strengthen identification by building credibility and trust with survivors who may fear law enforcement due to past trauma.



Identification extends far beyond law enforcement operations; training frontline professionals can help increase identification.

Prosecutorial success is tied to survivor well-being.

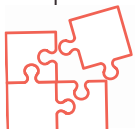
Trust and collaboration take time but lead to stronger survivor outcomes.
