*How does
labor trafficking
look in my community?*

Labor Trafficking is the recruitment, harboring, transportation, provision, or obtaining of a person for labor or services, through the use of force, fraud, or coercion for the purpose of subjection to involuntary servitude, peonage, debt bondage, or slavery. (22 U.S.C. § 7102(11)(B)).

Have you or anyone you know experienced any of these situations?

- Is the job that you have not what you signed up for?
- Does someone else control your documents, money, and/or personal items?
- Are you getting paid for all the hours you worked?
- Have you or your family been threatened by your boss or coworkers?
- Are you forced to work to pay off a large debt ?

You have the right to:

- Be paid for all hours worked.
- Work in a safe and healthy environment.
- Have control over your documents.
- Have the freedom to change jobs if it is unsafe or not getting paid.
