From Identification to Support: The Care Coordination Model Key Takeaways



Overview

-  Begins at point of crisis recovery or identification
-  Serves Commercially Sexually Exploited Youth (CSEY) for whom an investigation is not currently active or open
-  Serves CSEY regardless of active participation in the investigation or prosecution of their perpetrator

The Care Coordinator

-  Single point of contact when a CSEY recovered or identified
-  24/7 response for LE and DFPS in crisis recovery
-  Scheduling and facilitation of all Service Status Meetings and Advisory Council Meetings

The Texas Care Coordination Model was developed in response to fragmented services for commercially sexually exploited youth (CSEY). It exists so that no youth falls through the cracks.

Collaboration is Everything

Care Coordination brings together law enforcement, child advocacy centers, medical providers, schools, DFPS, and community partners to provide a coordinated response.

“The best way to prepare for difficult cases is by building trust with the very people you'll be working with.

Individualized Support

While a streamline protocol exists, services are tailored to meet the youth's needs, needs, strengths, and goals.

“The youth can also participate and voice their concerns during the multidisciplinary meeting.

“By coming together at one table, we're able to ensure everyone knows their role and the youth isn't carrying the burden alone.
